FIRST LESSON: Psalm 42

Just like a deer that craves streams of water, my whole being craves you, God. My whole being thirsts for God, for the living God. When will I come and see God's face? My tears have been my food both day and night, as people constantly questioned me, "Where's your God now?"

But I remember these things as I bare my soul: how I made my way to the mighty one's abode, to God's own house,

with joyous shouts and thanksgiving songs – a huge crowd celebrating the festival!

Why, I ask myself, are you so depressed? Why are you so upset inside?

Hope in God! Because I will again give him thanks, my saving presence and my God.

My whole being is depressed. That's why I remember you from the land of Jordan and Hermon, from Mount Mizar. Deep called to deep at the noise of your waterfalls; all your massive waves surged over me. By day the Lord commands his faithful love; by night his song is with me – a prayer to the God of my life.

I will say to God, my solid rock, "Why have you forgotten me? Why do I have to walk around, sad, oppressed by enemies?" With my bones crushed, my foes make fun of me, constantly questioning me: "Where's your God now?"

Why, I ask myself, are you so depressed? Why are you so upset inside? Hope in God! Because I will again give him thanks, my saving presence and my God.

SECOND LESSON: Galatians 3:23-29

Before faith came, we were guarded under the Law, locked up until faith that was coming would be revealed, so that the Law became our custodian until Christ so that we might be made righteous by faith.

But now that faith has come, we are no longer under a custodian.

You are all God's children through faith in Christ Jesus. All of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. There is neither Jew nor Greek; there is neither slave nor free; nor is there male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus. Now if you belong to Christ, then indeed you are Abraham's descendants, heirs according to the promise.

GOSPEL: Luke 8:26-39

Jesus and his disciples sailed to the Gerasenes' land, which is across the lake from Galilee. As soon as Jesus got out of the boat, a certain man met him. The man was from the city and was possessed by demons. For a long time, he had lived among the tombs, naked and homeless. When he saw Jesus, he shrieked and fell down before him. Then he shouted, "What have you to do with me, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I beg you, don't torture me!" He said this because Jesus had already commanded the unclean spirit to come out of the man. Many times it had taken possession of him, so he would be bound with leg irons and chains and placed under guard. But he would break his restraints, and the demon would force him into the wilderness.

Jesus asked him, "What is your name?"

"Legion," he replied, because many demons had entered him. They pleaded with him not to order them to go back into the abyss. A large herd of pigs was feeding on the hillside. The demons begged Jesus to let them go into the pigs. Jesus gave them permission, and the demons left the man and entered the pigs. The herd rushed down the cliff into the lake and drowned.

When those who tended the pigs saw what happened, they ran away and told the story in the city and in the countryside. People came to see what had happened. They came to Jesus and found the man from whom the demons had gone. He was sitting at Jesus' feet, fully dressed and completely sane. They were filled with awe. Those people who had actually seen what had happened told them how the demon-possessed man had been delivered. Then everyone gathered from the region of the Gerasenes asked Jesus to leave their area because they were overcome with fear. So he got into the boat and returned across the lake. The man from whom the demons had gone begged to come along with Jesus as one of his disciples. Jesus sent him away, saying, "Return home and tell the story of what God has done for you." So he went throughout the city proclaiming what Jesus had done for him.

Dear Churches of the Illinois South Conference, We have seen firsthand the powerful impact our Conference has had, offering churches the critical support required for effective ministry in the name of Jesus Christ. It is an awesome task to undertake, and we cannot do it alone. We need your continued investment in this essential work. Your donations, no matter the size, bring these ministries to reality.

Our Church's Wider Mission (OCWM) dollars are the primary revenue stream in the Illinois South Conference, as 80% of your donations to OCWM stay within our Conference, enabling us to fulfill our shared mission. As of May 31, 2025, giving to OCWM from local churches and individual donors is down 20% from last year. If this trend continues, we expect to realize an additional \$56,000 deficit, which will have to be covered with funds from investment reserves.

The Finance Ministry Team is monitoring the expenditures of ISC and DuBois Center, and expenses are going as expected, as per the budget approved at the 2024 ISC Annual Meeting last October. We continue to support each of our churches and pastors - with staffing search and call processes when churches are in search of a pastor; we aid in coordinating mission and relief efforts; we offer programs and services that train and equip faith leaders; and we strive to increase faith formation and outdoor experiences for all ages through ISC events and programming at DuBois Center. These expenditures are necessary to maintain the administration and enhance the discipleship programming of ISC.

After prayerful reflection, please give whatever feels right for your church family. Every contribution will be a statement of the resilient spirit of the Illinois South Conference and the collective mission of Jesus Christ. You make a difference when you donate.
