From the Pastor's Desk:

Men are not flattered by being shown that there has been a difference of purpose between the Almighty and them.

Abraham Lincoln

That quote appeared recently in our church bulletin's *Silent Reflection*, relating to the lectionary reading in *2 Samuel*; God's rejection of David's plan to build a temple to house the ark of the covenant.

Lincoln's quote originated in his fear that people had taken offense at his second inaugural speech. In that brief but brilliant address, Lincoln advocated leniency for the nearly defeated Confederacy. He was right to worry. Many people were very offended. There was popular sentiment for severe punishment for the leaders and the states involved in the revolt. In Washington, not all were saddened by Lincoln's assignation, considering his tendency to favor reconciliation, and their desire for retribution.

Today, people are also often offended, but it does not take a cataclysm like the Civil War to rile folks up. People were offended recently, outraged, demanding retribution and compensation, immediately, because they thought the 'minion' toy in their kid's happy meals was cursing. Really? That is something the world's second largest restaurant chain is going to do? Really? (Subway #1 by number of stores.)

Here is the trouble with trivial things getting blown out of proportion. As Christians, our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ called his followers to practice forgiveness. He asked his followers to turn the other cheek, and go the second mile. He gave us the example of forgiving even those who crucified him on the cross. How difficult is it to forgive when the surrounding culture constantly tells us to "sweat the small stuff", to be offended at every perceived slight.

Trivia nights are popular fund raisers in our churches. That's fine. For disciples of Jesus Christ there must, however, be careful discernment between what is trivial, and what are true matters of justice and fairness in the world. What is at risk is our ability to forgive one another and to live in true community together.
