Every day, we make decisions regarding what is, and what is not worth the investment of our time and effort. Those decisions include attending worship, or having our children attend Sunday school. These decisions are not easy for parents, especially those who are deeply invested in their children's social, physical, and emotional development and wellbeing. Sunday mornings are increasingly prime times for scheduling other organized children's activities. There may also be an earnest desire to allow some extra 'pillow time' for our youngster to catch up on their rest. No one ought to be unsympathetic to the many choices parents must make regarding what is best for their kids.

That being said, we might note that something like 95% of churches in America still offer some form of Sunday school program. Why so much time and resources dedicated to those efforts? Because they are of value for children. Sunday school is worthwhile.

Sunday school provides a positive, safe learning environment. It teaches children about our Christian faith and practices. It is a place to make friends, and to experience the positive role models of trusted adults who care deeply about children and give freely of themselves to benefit others. In Sunday school, kids learn and practice the Ten Commandments and the Golden Rule, foundations for growing up as people of faith and good citizens of our communities. They also engage in mission projects to help others. For the nursery kids, it may be their first organized learning activity with other children, a strong foundation for future success.

Why go to Casey? To see the Big Things obviously.

Why go to Sunday school? Because going to Sunday school certainly is worth the effort. Let's Go!
