Scripture tells us, "The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases, his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning" (Lamentations 3:22-23a, NRSV). Through God's love, we have the opportunity for a new beginning every, single day. We don't have to wait for a particular day on the calendar to seek renewal through forgiveness and God's love and grace. It's available to us every morning. So let us all go out and make today and every day a wonderful new year.
